

Exit-Interview Questions

Please read script to each student-athlete before asking questions:

“Thank you for agreeing to speak to me about your time as a student and athlete at Boise State University. Your responses will help improve the experiences of other student-athletes.

I am a faculty member and a member of our Intercollegiate Athletics Advisory Committee. I’m going to ask you nine questions. I will take notes and your name will be documented. However, your answers will be anonymous – that means that before anyone in Athletics reads your response, your name will be removed and you will only be identified by your sport (e.g., Women’s Tennis). Although your name will not be reported, people reading your responses might still be able to determine your identity. Your responses will be read by our Faculty Athletics Representative, institution’s Chief Compliance Officer, our NCAA Compliance staff, and Athletic Department administration reviewing exit-survey data. Your responses will become part of your educational record and will be protected under FERPA, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.

If allegations of sexual misconduct, criminal activity, academic misconduct, discrimination, or NCAA violations are reported, I am *required* to forward such reports to campus authorities. This might include disclosing your identity. You have the right to not answer any of my questions. You also have the option of anonymously and/or confidentially reporting incidents of sex and gender-discrimination, harassment, and violence to the Director of Title IX Compliance, University Health Services medical and/or counseling staff, or the Gender Equity Center (formerly the Women’s Center).

1. Describe the importance and impact on you of your athletics experiences?
2. To what extent did athletics time demands affect you while a student at Boise State University?
3. What does the Athletic Department already do to make your experience as a student and

athlete successful?

4. What changes could the Athletic Department make in order to improve your experience as a student and athlete?
5. What does your coach already do to make your experience as a student and athlete successful?
6. What could your coach do to improve your experience as a student and athlete?
7. What opinions do you have on any proposed changes in Division 1 intercollegiate athletics?
8. Do you have any concerns related to the administration of your specific sport that you would like to talk about?
9. Are there any other concerns or issues that you would like to talk about?
