It would be permissible for your institution to provide members of the [REDACTED] team with complimentary admissions to the national championship pursuant to Bylaw 16.2.1.1.1 regardless of whether the student-athletes have qualified individually for participation in the event, provided the team is participating in the event.

The flag was purchased at the █████. The Ed. Column from July 5, 1990 (attached) states it is permissible for "institutional equip or apparel items" to be autographed by SA's and auctioned to raise funds for the athletic program. The institution would like to know if this Ed Column can be applied to signing the █████ flag, even though it is not a "institutional equip or apparel item." The institution believes this request falls within the intent and all requirements of NCAA bylaw 12.5.1.1. Mainly in that all money derived from the item being auctioned will go directly to the athletic department and the activity does not involve any co-sponsorship with █████ nor will it promote them in any way.
