Good Morning Coaches,

This is a follow-up to review what was discussed in our meeting regarding Late Night in the Phog.

1. Unofficial Visits (Estimated to have 18 PSAs present for unofficial visits)
 - a. Meals, Snacks, and Refreshments
 - i. It is impermissible to provide a meal, snacks, or refreshments to a prospective student-athlete, and their guests, on an unofficial visit at no cost.
 - ii. If a PSA, and their guests, want to participate in a meal, snack, or refreshment; they must pay the actual cost per person. (We will need a sign-in sheet of all persons eating and the money collected must be turned in to the business office)
 - b. Ticket Reservations
 - i. For unofficial and official visitors, it is permissible to reserve additional seats any guests over the legislated allotment.
 - ii. Names of the additional guests must be provided in order to make the reservations.
 - c. Unofficial Visit with PSA not present
 - i. It is permissible to provide complimentary admissions through a pass list pursuant to unofficial visit legislation, even though the PSA may not be present for the event.
2. Student-Athlete
 - a. Ticket Reservations
 - i. Waiting on interpretation from NCAA.
 - b. Parking
 - i. Each student-athlete who has a car on-campus, and registered with the Compliance Office, will be provided with one (1) parking pass for the event. If there is any player missing from the attached list of who has a car, please have them come see me in the Compliance Office so we can get the necessary paperwork on file.
3. [REDACTED]
 - a. Participation in Late Night Activities
 - i. [REDACTED] is allowed to participate in any activities that are not considered CARA. Essentially, anything that does not involve physical, basketball related action. (Introduction, skits, dance, etc)
 - ii. It is impermissible for [REDACTED] to participate in the practice portions of Late Night, and it is impermissible for him to sit on the bench during countable activities as well.

13.7.3.1.2 Meals. A prospective student-athlete on an unofficial visit to an institution may pay the actual cost of meals (or the regular cost of training-table meals) and eat with other prospective student-athletes who are on their official visits or with enrolled student-athletes. [R]

Food and Beverage During Unofficial Visits (I)

Division: I

Interpretation:

The academic and membership affairs staff confirmed that during an unofficial visit, an institution may provide food and beverages to a prospective student-athlete and individuals accompanying the prospective student-athlete (even if the meal is not open to the public), provided the prospective student-athlete and any individuals accompanying the prospective student-athlete pay the actual cost.

Activities at an Off-Campus Practice or Competition Facility during an Unofficial Visit (I)

Division: I

Date Published: May 26, 2010

Item Ref: 1

Interpretation:

The academic and membership affairs staff determined that the following activities at an off-campus practice or competition facility are permissible during an unofficial visit, provided the prospective student-athlete visits the institution's campus during the unofficial visit:

- a. The unofficial visit may begin or end at an off-campus practice or competition facility (e.g., golf course, boathouse);
- b. The prospective student-athlete is permitted to eat a meal at an off-campus practice or competition facility, provided he or she pays the actual cost of the meal; and
- c. Contact during the unofficial visit between institutional staff members or student-athletes and the prospective student-athlete at an off-campus practice or competition facility is not considered an off-campus contact.

13.7.3.1.5 Reserving Game Tickets. [A] An institution may reserve tickets (in addition to the permissible complimentary admissions) for the use of additional individuals accompanying a prospective student-athlete during an unofficial visit and for seat locations adjacent to the complimentary seats being provided to the prospective student-athlete. Such tickets must be purchased at face value. [R] (Adopted: 1/10/92, Revised: 1/16/19 effective 8/1/19)

16.2.1.1 Institutional Events in the Student-Athlete's Sport. [A] An institution may provide four complimentary admissions per home or away intercollegiate athletics event to a student-athlete in the sport in which the individual participates (either practices or competes), regardless of whether the student-athlete competes in the contest. [R] (Revised: 8/7/14)
